One Hundred and Fifty First Report	Report on Admiralty Jurisdiction - 1994	Not available	<p>Accepted.</p> <p>Status:</p> <p>In its meeting held on 17.02.2005 the Union Cabinet approved the proposal of this Ministry for enactment of Admiralty Act of India. Accordingly, the Admiralty Bill 2005 was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 11.5.2005 which was referred to the Department related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Transport, Tourism and Culture. The Committee in its 99th Report presented on 21.3.2006 gave its recommendations on the Bill. However, the Bill lapsed with the dissolution of the 14th Lok Sabha. Therefore, the Bill is to be introduced afresh.</p> <p>The Admiralty Bill 2005 has since been revised to incorporate the recommendations of the Standing Committee and the title of the Bill has been changed to Admiralty (Jurisdiction and Settlement of Maritime Claims) Bill. This Bill, prepared by the Directorate General of Shipping in consultation with stakeholders, has been sent to the Legislative Department on 15.4.2014 for vetting at draft stage and seeking the working draft of the revised Bill, as approved by the Legislative Department.</p> <p>The working draft as and when received from the Legislative Department, will be subjected to a pre-legislative consultation by uploading it in the DG (Shipping) website for a period of 30 days followed by stakeholder consultations. Thereafter a draft Cabinet note will on the Bill will be prepared and the proposal will be placed before the Union Cabinet after inter-ministerial consultations.</p>
